

## Equipment for Amateur Station

### 1. Provision of equipment

- 1.1 Radio amateurs are free to choose any radio equipment designed for the amateur service. Radio amateurs may also design and build their own equipment provided that the requirements and limitations specified in the Amateur Station Licence and Schedules thereto are complied with.
- 1.2 Pursuant to section 9 of the Telecommunications Ordinance (Cap 106) (the “Ordinance”), any person who wishes to import any radio transmitting equipment into Hong Kong needs to obtain an import permit from the Communications Authority unless he / she is the holder of an appropriate licence e.g. Radio Dealer Licence (Unrestricted). Failure to do so may result in the equipment being impounded by the Customs officer.
- 1.3 In submitting application for the permit, the applicant should provide full details of the make and model of the equipment and its operating frequency bands. A fee has to be paid for the permit. ### 2. Radio Dealer and Radio Dealer Licence

A radio dealer is anyone who deals in the course of trade or business in apparatus or material for radiocommunications or in any component part of any kind that generates and emits radio waves. Under the Ordinance, such a dealer has to be licensed. Radio amateurs should buy and sell his radio equipment from and to licensed radio dealers only.
